WELCOME TO Hartsfield Manor

Hartsfield Manor was built as a family home in the 1860s by Arthur Woodriff Jaffray. Before the house was completed Arthur died in a shooting accident in 1864. He left a young widow Mary and their only daughter Lilian. There is a memorial for Arthur Jaffray at the west wall of St Michaels Church in Betchworth. The lych-gate at the entrance to the churchyard is also dedicated to him.

Carvings around the main entrance point to the estimated completion of Hartsfield Manor as 1869 and in 1871 Mary remarried Captain James Moir. They had six children, three of whom remained in the village and were known by many Betchworth villagers. Mary died in 1885 and Hartsfield was sold on several times.

In the Second World War Hartsfield Manor was requisitioned by the Canadian army and post-war the house was run as a hotel. In 1971 it became a staff training college for Midland Bank. Many changes were made internally and several buildings were added.

It was acquired by Securicor in 1994, then Initial Style Conference in 1998, who were then taken over by De Vere Venues in 2006, to then be sold to the Manor Collection Group. Finally, it was sold once more to HB Opco Ltd who are the current owners since the summer of 2025.
